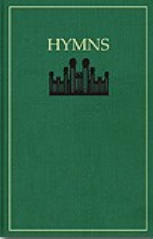

His name is Jesus.

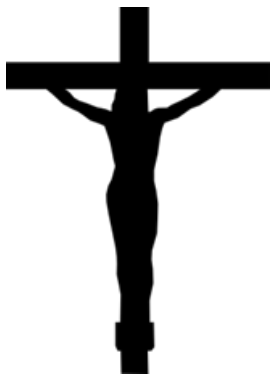
When the soul in anguish cries,

Have you ever reflected on the gift of eyesight that God gave? Autumn colors, children playing, delightful sunsets, the happy faces of friends and family and so much more are all possible since we can see. Now some of us have had corrective lenses to see better or cataracts removed to allow us to again see clearly. Good eyesight is such a blessing when we realize it is a gift of God to teach us about the most important vision, **spiritual eyesight**. The Bible has much to say of this awesome blessing that God must give the individual if we are to enjoy Him and His heaven forever.

This past Sunday Chapel Hour, Pastor Tom Weimer gave a powerful lesson on really seeing what God has for us and who Jesus is. He used the story in John 9 of Jesus healing a man who was blind from birth. God initiated a wonderful miracle as Jesus made a paste of mud and put it on the man's eyes telling him to go and wash in the pool of Siloam. When he obeyed believing Jesus, his eyes were opened and he saw for the first time. People couldn't believe it and kept asking him how he could see. He said, "Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a man born blind. If this Man were not from God, he could do nothing." (John 9:32-33) The angry and jealous Pharisees would not believe Jesus was sent from God so they cast the healed man out of the synagogue. Hearing this, Jesus came to talk again with the man asking, "do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered, "And who is he sir, that I may believe in him? When Jesus revealed to him it was He who healed him and was now speaking to him, he said. "Lord, I believe" and he worshiped him (John 9:38). He now had **both physical eyesight and spiritual eyesight**.

In Psalm 19:8 we read, "the commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes." Again in Psalm 119:18, David prayed, "**Open my eyes**, that I may behold wondrous things out of your law." God continues to offer spiritual eyesight to all who will come and believe in Jesus alone for their salvation, who will seek Him in His Word. We daily need God to open our eyes to His truth and to see what He wants to do in this world now through you and me. Let's pray the hymn by Clara Scott, "Open My Eyes." "**silently now I wait for Thee, ready my God, Thy will to see; open my eyes, illumine me, Spirit divine!**" ~ Chaplain Dave

The tenth month by our Gregorian calendar, *October* shares a root with *octopus* and *octothorpe*—the Latin *octo-*, meaning “eight.”

In the Roman calendar, which had only ten months, October was the 8th month, as January and February hadn't been added to the calendar yet! Like its neighboring months *September*, *November*, and *December*, the numerical name stuck; even after Julius Caesar expanded the calendar year from ten months to twelve. *October* entered Old English via Old French, replacing the English vernacular term *Winterfylleð*. (Winter month)
